## From Munich to Erl, Symphony of the Alps with Jonas Kaufmann and Irene Roberts

Why choose between Bavaria and Tyrol when you can have both? Especially during the Easter period, when chocolate hares and delicious *Osterbrot* fill the shelves. In Munich, the markets and streets are full of painted eggs. In the Austrian Alps, tradition is in full swing during Holy Week, with processions and festivities of all kinds. Innsbruck is decked out with Easter decorations and markets, while the Passionspielhaus in Erl stages a re-enactment of the last moments in the life of Christ every 6 years (and until 2025).

The repertory theatre that is the Bayerische Staatsoper confirms its prestige, with first-rate singers, even for its revivals - **Ermonela Jaho** and **Yusif Eyvazov** in Puccini's rare *Manon Lescaut*. The Erl Festival, directed by star tenor **Jonas Kaufmann**, finds a fitting programme, with the *St Matthew Passion* and *Parsifal*. Bach's delicate yet powerful oratorio, meanwhile, is performed on Good Friday, as it was at its premiere.

## MANON LESCAUT, in Munich

After Auber and Massenet, it was Puccini's turn to adapt Abbé Prévost's novel on his return from Bayreuth in the 1890s, in what was to be his first great public success. He would say that, unlike his predecessors, he saw the heroine "like an Italian, consumed

by passion". The result is a structure in four acts separated by ellipses, like so many stages in the exile of Manon and Des Grieux.

## ST MATTHEW PASSION, at the Tyrol Festival Erl

The *St Matthew Passion* takes up two chapters of the Gospel, from the Last Supper to the burial of Jesus, including his appearance before the high priest and his crucifixion on Mount Golgotha. This oratorio alternates narrative recitatives, arias crystallising the action (in the style of opera seria) and weightless Lutheran charales

## PARSIFAL, at the Tyrol Festival Erl

The mystery of Parsifal is one of the best-kept secrets in the repertoire. The combination of instrumental timbres provides an unprecedented aural experience, where "time becomes space", as Gurnemanz says in the first act. Everything lies in the orchestra's dramaturgy, brought to its climax. Wagner's libretto, infused with multiple inspirations, is as much about spirituality as it is about responsibility. •


Kaufmann wants to offer unique and daring productions, while honouring the musical heritage that has characterised the Tyrol Erl Festival since its foundation.

#### **JEDDAH**

A vibrant port city founded in the 7th century, **Jeddah** has always been a cultural and commercial crossroads, welcoming merchants and pilgrims from all over the world. Often referred to as the "Bride of the Red Sea", this dynamic coastal metropolis is not only the gateway to the pilgrimage to Mecca, but also a city where modernity and tradition live side by side in harmony. Its rich history is reflected in its architecture, bustling markets and traditions.

The **historic district of Al-Balad**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is a must-see. Famous for its traditional coral houses, narrow streets and colourful souks, Al-Balad takes you back in time to the heart of authentic Jeddah. Wind towers and carved wooden balconies bear witness to the city's architectural ingenuity and rich cultural heritage.

The floating mosque, or **Al-Rahma Mosque**, is an architectural landmark located on the Jeddah Corniche. Built on stilts above the Red Sea, it gives the impression of floating during high tides, creating a masterly visual spectacle. Its modern design blends traditional and contemporary Islamic influences, making it a highly sought-after place of prayer and contemplation.

## ALULA

Located in the north-west region of Saudi Arabia, **AlUla** is a fascinating destination. Famous for its majestic rock formations and breathtaking archaeological sites, this desert gem is a real gem for lovers of archaeology, geology and adventure. From red cliffs to wind-sculpted canyons, every corner of this region is a natural work of art.

**Hegra**, also known as Madain Salih, is the first UNESCO World Heritage Site in Saudi Arabia. The monumental tombs, carved directly into the sandstone cliffs and adorned with elaborate facades, bear witness to the advanced architecture and artistic skills of the Nabataeans, an Arab civilisation that flourished between the 1st century BC and the 1st century AD.

Archaeological excavations have revealed impressive statues, inscriptions and monumental structures in **Dadan**, the capital of the Lihyan kingdom. Nearby is the site of **Jabal Ikmah**, often described as an "open-air library" because of the hundreds of inscriptions in Dadanite, Thamudic, Nabataean and other ancient languages engraved on the rocks.

Thanks to its mirror-covered facades, AlUla's theatre, the **Maraya**, blends into the spectacular surrounding desert landscape.

## A STAGE OF THE DAKAR RALLY

One of the highlights of your stay will undoubtedly be a day spent following a stage of the **2025 Dakar Rally**, formerly known as the Paris-Dakar and relocated to Saudi Arabia in 2020.

During this race, the drivers cross breathtaking landscapes: endless sand dunes, steep mountains and rocky plains, putting their endurance, navigability and technical skills to the test. Each stage is designed to offer a unique challenge, making this one of the world's most fearsome rallies.

Attending a stage of the Dakar Rally in Saudi Arabia is an unforgettable experience. Spectators get to see the vehicles in action up close, feel the adrenalin of the race while enjoying the warm hospitality of the Saudis. The Dakar Rally is much more than just a race: it is an epic adventure that celebrates the spirit of challenge and exploration.

## Kyoto, Naoshima, Tokyo – Gardens and Setouchi Triennale

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Japan, a country with a thousand faces, embodies exceptional cultural and artistic wealth. From its ancestral traditions to its contemporary art forms, it offers a kaleidoscope of creativity. But what gives Japan an even more special aura are its magnificent gardens, veritable living works of art.

The itinerary of your stay in Japan will be divided between Kyoto, Nara, Naoshima and Tokyo.

A former imperial capital, Kyoto is a cultural treasure trove of temples, Zen gardens and geishas. Nara, the historic cradle of Japan, is famous for its free-roaming deer and ancient temples. Naoshima is a contemporary art lover's paradise, home to museums and installations by renowned artists. Tokyo, the bustling capital, blends tradition and modernity. Its futuristic skyscrapers stand alongside thousand-year-old temples, and its lively districts are home to contemporary art galleries.

In 2025, a major art event, the Setouchi Triennale, returns to showcase talent from the country and around the world. This event promises to be a unique opportunity to celebrate art in all its forms.

#### күото

The former imperial capital of Japan, Kyoto is a cultural and historical treasure trove

At the heart of this city steeped in tradition, gardens occupy a central place. Most of Kyoto's many green spaces are associated with temples, shrines, villas or imperial complexes. Their Zen aesthetic and tranquillity bring a profound sense of serenity.

The most exclusive (a covering letter in Japanese is required to apply for a visit!) is the famous **Moss Garden**, or **Saihō-ji**. It boasts a peaceful atmosphere and lush vegetation. In this haven of peace, 120 varieties of moss cover the ground, century-old trees stand majestically, and the ponds reflect the serenity of the place. Usually closed to the public, you'll have the chance to wander through it accompanied by its gardener.

Each of these gardens tells a story, reflects an era and offers a unique experience.

Kyoto, with its wealth of vegetation, is a haven of peace for those in search of harmony and beauty.

## NARA

Formerly known as Heijo-kyo, Nara was Japan's first permanent imperial capital. Despite its short existence of just 14 years, Nara marked an artistic and cultural boom. Today, the city is home to numerous World Heritage sites: the historic monuments of ancient Nara, the Buddhist monuments of the Horyuji region (home to the oldest wooden buildings in the world) and the pilgrimage routes in the Kii mountain range. Nara is also a natural park home to thousands of sacred deer, symbols of the city.

#### **NAOSHIMA**

Naoshima, a small island in the Seto Inland Sea, is an artistic jewel. Once exploited as an industrial site by the Mitsubishi company, the former mining town has been transformed into an art capital thanks to the initiative of the chairman of the Benesse company, Soichiro Fukutake.

In collaboration with architect Tadao Ando, Naoshima has become the "Benesse Art Site Naoshima", bringing together contemporary art museums, architectural buildings and outdoor sculptures. One of the island's must-sees is the Benesse House Museum, which stands on a point on the south coast. Its conceptual concrete architecture houses priceless works of art... a hotel where you'll be lucky enough to stay! Naoshima, once deserted, is now a world cultural pilgrimage destination.

## TOKYO

Art in Tokyo is not limited to museums and galleries: the city itself is a constantly evolving work of art.

As soon as you set foot in Tokyo, you are immediately plunged into a teeming artistic universe, where the streets become living canvases where colours and shapes mingle.

You will have the opportunity to meet **Natane Takeda, VIP curator of Art Basel Japan**, for a tour of the city. Her invaluable explanations will provide you with the keys you need to understand Tokyo's contemporary art.

Far from the hustle and bustle of Tokyo, the Echigo-Tsumari Art Field lies in Niigata Prefecture. Kitagawa Fram, general manager of the Echigo-Tsumari Art Fiel Triennale and the Naoshima Triennale, will guide you on an exceptional tour of this art center nicknamed "the Naoshima of the mountains". This art festival, with its 20-year history, stretches over 750 km2, making it the world's largest open-air exhibition. Works of art await in the heart of nature, inviting visitors on artistic walks.•

It is this choral version that will be performed at this traditional New Year's Eve concert by the **Gulbenkian Foundation Choir** at the Church of São Roque, an imposing 16th-century baroque church, alongside sacred works by Poulenc, Frank Martin and Miguel Jesus. This musical event, part of the city's cultural traditions, promises to create a solemn and introspective atmosphere, resonating with the architectural magnificence of the church.

The **Gulbenkian Foundation Choir**, renowned for its precision and passion, will bring a unique emotional depth to this evening of celebration. As well as the musical beauty, the audience will be able to appreciate the exceptional acoustics of the Church of São Roque, which amplify and enrich every note, offering an unforgettable aural experience. •

## INTERVIEW WITH YOUR EXPERT SPEAKER: LAMA TYAN

As a chorister with the Orchestre National and a lover of culture and languages, Lama Tyan shares her love of the voice through sessions dedicated to operas, themes and sacred music.

La Fugue (LF): The recital by Anna Netrebko and Yusif Eyvazov is a much-anticipated evening at the Théâtre des Champs-Élysées. How do you feel about this duo on stage and off?

Lama Tyan (LT): What are a soprano and a tenor talking about? Love, of course, and with these two, we believe it! After all, Anna and Yusif have been in love for ten years or so, performing together on stages the world over and forming an undeniably iconic operatic couple. The Italian programme, a tribute to Puccini, will showcase their vocal understanding in an exceptional fusion performance.

LF: Why is this performance of Werther, co-produced with La Scala

in Milan and starring Benjamin Bernheim in the title role, so eagerly awaited?

LT: The staging by multi-award winner Christoph Loy promised to be elegant. The eagerly awaited Milan premiere was a triumph on 10 June. According to Il Corriere Musicale, Bernheim melted into the character of Werther, exceeding the limits of his range and covering the powerful waves of the orchestra! I first heard Benjamin Bernheim in the summer of 2014 in Salzburg in Schubert's Fierrabras. A clear, youthful voice rang out above all others! Since then, he has become a benchmark in the French repertoire and is currently at the top of his game.

Who better to bring passion and passion to the tormented character of Werther? Having already performed the role in 2022 at the Opéra de Bordeaux, there's no doubt that his seductive timbre and expressiveness will add extra depth to the 'Wertherian fever'. •

## ANNA NETREBKO & YUSIF EYVAZOV CONCERT

Of course, everything has been said and written about **Anna Netrebko**. The Russian-born singer is unquestionably one of the greatest and most renowned sopranos today.

Since the start of her meteoric career in 1994, she has established herself as the undisputed prima donna of the 21st century. What strikes you most when you hear her in concert is the immense sonic impact of her voice, which leaves you breathless from the very first note. In recent years, her repertoire has expanded to include superbly dramatic roles, and she now interprets the most impressive heroines of Italian and Russian opera.

It is precisely a bouquet of scenes from Italian operas that she will be performing at the Théâtre des Champs-Élysées. Accompanied by tenor (and husband) **Yusif Eyvazov**, THE Netrebko promises a breathtaking performance of virtuoso power.

#### WERTHER

Charlotte's mother wanted her to marry Albert... But when Charlotte meets the poet Werther, she discovers both love and suffering.

Torn between family duty and the torments of passion, will Charlotte remain faithful to her husband or abandon herself to Werther?

Inspired by Goethe's *The Sorrows of Young Werther*, *Werther* is one of the pinnacles of French opera.

First performed in 1892, Massenet's music overwhelms with its naturalness and the truth of its characters. While the role of Werther is moving, that of Charlotte is not to be outdone, with sublime arias such as the tunes *Air des Lettres* and *Du gai soleil plein de flamme*.

In the past, people used to talk about the poor health of French singing. Those days are over: all the specialists agree that French song is enjoying a new golden age, and this show, directed by the renowned German director **Christof Loy**, will not prove the contrary.

The cast at the Théâtre des Champs-Élysées is of the highest calibre, and almost exclusively French: **Benjamin Bernheim** (solar voice, marvellous actor), the remarkable **Marina Viotti**, whose career is on the rise, and the superb **Jean-Sébastien Bou**.

In the pit we find **Les Siècles**, an orchestra playing on period instruments. •

There have been no fewer than three productions of Richard Strauss's opera in the last ten years, but if there is one staging that has won unanimous acclaim, it is **Harry Kupfer**'s. The sets take us back to 1911, the year the work was first performed. In Franz Josef's Vienna, echoes of a film as legendary as *The Leopard* by Visconti (a great Milanese before all eternity) are revealed in this portrait of an aristocracy in

decline. As well as the trio of **Stoyanova**, **Lindsey** and **Devieilhe**, all eyes are on the pit, of course, with the exceptional presence of **Kirill Petrenko**.

Housed in a magnificent 17th-century palace in Milan, the **Pinacoteca di Brera** is an artistic sanctuary containing a remarkable collection of Italian works of art. Among the jewels in its collections is Mantegna's exceptional Lamentation over the Dead Christ.

## INTERVIEW WITH YOUR EXPERT SPEAKER: LAMA TYAN

La Fugue (LF): Why do you consider these performances to be the most eagerly awaited of the new season?

Lama Tyan (LT): It's almost too good to be true... three consecutive evenings of this intensity at the Teatro Alla Scala. Music lovers from all over the world have gathered to listen to two immense maestros. Believe me, tickets are going to be snapped up!

Personally, I have always followed Thielemann throughout Europe... An advocate of the great Germanic repertoire, he is the absolute eminence in the Wagnerian register. He will conduct the premiere of *The Rhinegold*, the prelude to the new *Ring* commissioned by the Milanese theatre from David McVicar.

Do I need to introduce the talented Kirill Petrenko? The Russian maestro gave me my greatest musical thrills in Munich, Berlin and New York. His passion and happiness as he conducts are visible and infectious, and he magnifies the works he performs.

Not to mention the symphony evening with the young Finnish conductor Tarmo Peltokoski, who will conduct works by his compatriot Sibelius, and the virtuoso violinist Leonidas Kavakos!

LF: Why do you think Michael Volle's appearance as Wotan is such a big deal?

LT: Michael Volle is a charismatic singer with an 'ideal' voice that's as powerful in the lows as it is in the highs. His generous timbre and stage presence give his performances an uncommon sense of authenticity. You'll come away transformed! Named Singer of the Year by Opernwell magazine in 2008 and 2014, the German baritone is currently outshining all his rivals in the role of Wotan.

LF: What do you make of Harry Kupfer's production of The Knight of the Rose?

LT: This production is one of my fondest memories of the Salzburg Festival. Harry Kupfer is one of those who have radically changed the way opera is staged. He gives us his vision of *The Knight of the Rose*, which is profoundly human, since the subject of the work is the ineluctable passage of time and the resignation of an ageing woman of thirty-two... The absolutely spectacular set design is based on panoramic tableaux of breathtaking beauty. •

## **WEST SIDE STORY**

Vertical shots of Manhattan, a distant whistle, the camera suddenly plunges onto a basketball court where a group of young men are snapping their fingers...

The prologue to *West Side Story* has become the stuff of film legend. Although the film won ten Oscars in 1962, it is first and foremost a musical.

The genesis of *West Side Story* dates back to 1949. The choreographer Jerome Robbins suggested to Leonard Bernstein a modern version of Romeo and Juliet with street brawls between Jewish and Catholic groups. The composer was enthusiastic about the idea of creating a "musical tragedy", but soon gave up because of his duties as conductor.

The project was revived six years later when Bernstein met the playwright Arthur Laurents in a Beverly Hills hotel. Laurents had set the stage for the conflict between two rival gangs of "Americans" and Puerto Rican newcomers. This close-knit team was joined by the exceptional talent of the very young lyricist Stephen Sondheim, who was soon to become the king of Broadway.

The first rehearsals began enthusiastically, and the New York premiere on 26 September 1957 was hailed as a milestone in the history of American music. The show ran for 772 performances at the Winter Garden for two years.

Author of such gems as *Wonderful Town* and *Candide*, Bernstein has perhaps never written more beautiful music than *West Side Story*. Inflamed by the rhythms of Latin America, particularly Cuba, the score displays a dazzling diversity, often reaching operatic grandeur. In this collection of "hits", it's hard to single out one, and everyone will choose their own: from the *Mambo* in the ballroom scene, to *America America* to the rhythm of Huapango, not forgetting *I feel pretty* or *Maria Maria*...

Venezuelan conductor **Gustavo Dudamel** can be counted on to ignite the Latin rhythms of Bernstein's score. In the role of the tragic couple, the Peruvian **Juan Diego Flórez** has the golden voice to play Tony and the American **Nadine Sierra** (who has Puerto Rican roots) has the ideal quivering sensitivity to play Maria.

## LA SAGRADA FAMILIA TERMINÉE EN 2026?

The Sagrada Familia in Barcelona is one of the world's most emblematic works of architecture, designed by the visionary architect Antoni Gaudí.

This is one of Richard Strauss's most unfairly overlooked operas. After the death of Hugo von Hofmannsthal, the German composer thought his operatic career was over. But he did not count on his meeting with the writer Stefan Zweig, with whom he created *The Silent Woman*.

The story is deliberately that of an opera buffa: a man who hates noise marries a woman he thought would be silent... Alas, History with a capital H would sweep away this endearing work, since in 1935 the Nazis were in power and Stefan Zweig had already fled because of his Jewishness. Worse still, the play was quickly banned and had to wait many decades for its true value to be recognised.

So it's a powerful gesture that conductor **Christian Thielemann** is proposing for his very first show at the helm of the Berlin Staatsoper. German director **Jan Philipp Gloger** is the ideal choice to assist him. In the title role, the American **Brenda Rae** follows in the footsteps of Natalie Dessay, who left her mark on the history of the role. •

## Joyce di Donato, Elīna Garanča, René Pape, Rachel Willis-Sørensen

#### **PARSIFAL**

Richard Wagner's last opera, this "sacred stage festival" recounts the quest for the Holy Grail with a grandeur tinged with spirituality. Yet **Dmitri Tcherniakov** has chosen to strip the work of all religious decorum in this Berlin production. Musically, the vocal cast is full of promise. In the title role, **Andreas Schager** has all the heroism required. **Tomas Tomasson** as Klingsor and **Lauri Vasar** as Amfortas are captivating in their commitment, while **René Pape**'s Gurnemanz offers a formidable lesson in singing and **Elina Garanča** creates a sensation as Kundry.

#### NORMA

Set against a politico-historical backdrop, Bellini's opera re-enacts the eternal dilemma between public duty and private drama. From the opening recitative, **Rachel Willis-Sørensen** establishes herself as a great interpreter of the lead role. As powerful as she is electric, the American soprano offers a very fine psychological portrait, enhanced by velvety piani. **Vasily Barkhatov**'s staging gives her a veritable showcase in which to shine. •

## Festival Opening Concert, Gala Wagner, Jonas Kaufmann, René Pape, Lise Davidsen

The Austrian premiere of the dreamlike *Picture a Day Like This*, conducted by **Corinna Niemeyer**, is also in keeping with the contemporary creation DNA of the Austrian event.

#### **FESTIVAL OPENING CONCERT**

The programme for this inaugural evening features thematic and textural juxtapositions.

## PICTURE A DAY LIKE THIS

George Benjamin is one of the leading figures in music today. With his faithful librettist Martin Crimp, he has taken the philosophical tale format and told a universal and poetic story with many facets.

A woman has one day to find a happy person who, according to a prophecy, can bring her recently deceased infant back to life. The parade of characters she encounters along the way marries a sensitive score with breathtaking textures and telluric energy.

## GALA WAGNER

As a true Romantic, Liszt was keen to push instrumental music to its limits, in particular by sculpting it on the basis of poetic language. This *leitmotiv* approach is a vertiginous source of inspiration for Wagner's *Tetralogy*, of which *The Valkyrie* is the second part.

Act I reveals the meeting of Sieglinde and Siegmund, followed by a forbidden love, the trigger for the fantastic epic between humans and gods that continues to shape the history of the operatic world.•

Despite the a priori dissimilar trajectories of *Bluebeard's Castle* and *The Human Voice*, director **Claus Guth** makes one the keystone of the other in the same evening, where two face-to-face confrontations confront a couple with their finitude. Bartók's only opera traces a path to Judith - Bluebeard's recent and last wife - through seven doors, linked to numbers that owe as much to Hungarian musical folklore as to the German and French masters.

#### **RIGOLETTO**

Who would have thought that a hunchback - and a baritone at that - would play the lead role in a plot that had twice been rejected by the Venetian censors? Verdi sensed the appeal of his melodies, so much so that he imposed an embargo - no whistling or singing - on the orchestra musicians for the aria "La donna è mobile" before the first performance. Ludovic Tézier, one of the best interpreters of the protagonist today, will light up the stage with Julia Muzychenko-Greenhalgh, a young talent to be followed very closely. •

## A MASKED BALL

A Masked Ball marks a major milestone in Verdi's work. Premiered in 1859, the opera marks the abandonment of *bel canto* for a more dramatic style that was to culminate in later masterpieces.

The work was inspired by a real event, the assassination of King Gustav III of Sweden at a masked ball in 1791, which caused serious censorship problems. The action, already moved to Boston, was set in Naples when the opera was first performed in Paris in 1861.

In **Massimo Gasparon**'s beautiful staging (recreated from Pierluigi Samaritani's), we find ourselves in the 18th century.

Here, the singers have plenty of time to display their bewitching art, especially as the cast includes a trio of no less than exceptional performers: the Italian tenor (and star in his own country) **Piero Pretti**, the imperial **Anna Netrebko** and our national **Ludovic Tézier**, considered to be the finest Verdian singer of our time. •

Salzburg is the musical city par excellence.

## WIENER PHILHARMONIKER / SONYA YONCHEVA

Mozart's musical genius is such that we think of him as an isolated phenomenon. In reality, the Austrian composer stands at the crossroads of eras: one foot in the Baroque Age of Enlightenment, the other (already) in the Romanticism of the 19th century.

This concert by the legendary **Vienna Philharmonic** conducted by the prodigious **Thomas Guggeis** (the Finnish conductor is undoubtedly the new star of the next few years) presents a Mozart in touch with his two elders: Bach on the one hand, but also Händel, whose splendid operatic excerpts are sung by the glorious Bulgarian soprano **Sonya Yoncheva**.

#### MAHLER CHAMBER ORCHESTRA

From the introduction to *Concerto No. 21*, we are thrown into the light-hearted atmosphere of Don Giovanni. Like the *adagio* of *Concerto No. 23*, the slow movement is one of Mozart's most famous melodies.

This sublime masterpiece will be performed this evening by the immense Japanese specialist **Mitsuko Uchida** alongside a superb concerto grosso by Händel.

#### ORFEO

L'Orfeo is a milestone in the history of music. It may even be the most important event of the last five centuries, since Monteverdi's work symbolises (wrongly, since other works preceded it) the birth of onera.

For this pinnacle of Western music, Mozart Week is inviting a highly acclaimed production from Dresden directed by **Nikolaus Habjan**.

Conductor **Christina Pluhar**, at the head of her ensemble **L'Arpeggiata**, no longer needs to prove her affinity with this repertoire, and the cast includes **Rolando Villazón**'s *Orfeo* (also director of Mozart Week), who will be accompanied by such seasoned Baroque singers as **Céline Scheen** as the Nymph and **Cyril Auvity** as Apollo.

**WIENER PHILHARMONIKER / CHAMBER ORCHESTRA OF EUROPE**How can you resist the voice of **Juan Diego Flórez**? The Peruvian tenor performs here in a selection of top-flight Mozart arias.

This concert by the **Vienna Philharmonic** conducted by the excellent Ukrainian conductor **Oksana Lyniv** is not the only Annocident treat, as we hear one of Mozart's masterpieces for violin and Händel's magnificent *Water Music*.

This 'music on water' was composed by Händel for a festival on the River Thames in honour of King George I, which took place on 17 July

A beautiful summer evening, richly decorated boats filled with lords and ladies and an orchestra of 50 musicians playing on board a huge barge. Almost 300 years later, this masterly music has lost none of its freshness.

## CAPPELLA ANDREA BARCA

At the end of his short life, Mozart developed a passion for the music of Johann Sebastian Bach. With its rich contrapuntal writing, the magnificent *Concerto No. 25* bears the marks of this discovery.

The immense Hungarian pianist **András Schiff** plays and conducts from his keyboard this superb concerto, full of majesty and a gateway to Beethovenian Romanticism.

At the head of the **Cappella Andrea Barca**, the musician will continue the enchantment with one of the most beautiful Brandenburg concertos and a triple concerto by Bach. •

A few years later, she was being hailed as the 'new Anna Netrebko', and she was performing on the world's greatest stages - not least in Carmen, one of her signature roles, which she reprised at London's Royal Opera House in a new production by Damiano Michieletto.

In 2018, as part of the bucolic Baugé opera festival in Anjou, the young mezzo-soprano Aigul Akhmetshina was already causing a sensation: aged just 22 at the time, she was noted for her "deep, amber timbre, rich in harmonics", already revealing a temperament on stage that led people to say at the time that "she would undoubtedly make her mark on the international operatic landscape of the next few years". Today, Aigul Akhmetshina is 27, sings on the world's greatest stages and is heralded by opera circles as the "new Anna Netrebko".

Born into a modest family in the Urals, she decided that she would become a singer at the age of six, after her first public performance at a school festival. She joined a singing class, left at 14 to take a classical course at Ufa Arts College, already winning local prizes, and then tried to get into Moscow University to study music. On her way home, however, a car accident "almost destroyed (her) voice".

Her mother, who was bringing up her three children alone, encouraged her to opt for "more stable studies than music". Aigul Akhmetshina was about to give up singing. She considered "journalism or psychology". Her music teachers talked her out of it: she had to wait a year before she could apply to university again, which would be the opportunity to "rebuild her voice". At the same time as rebuilding her voice, she was invited to take part in a singing competition in Moscow, where she met the casting director of the Royal Opera House's young artists programme, Jette Parker, who opened the doors to London for her. She was 21 and this was the start of her operatic career.

The Royal Opera House gave her her first real roles: Preziosilla in La Force du Destin, Sonyetka in Mzensk's Lady Macbeth, Flora in Traviata, and Maddalena in Rigoletto, as well as Mercedes and above all the title role in Carmen, which became one of her signature roles.

## "50 shades of Carmen"

This season, Aigul Akhmetshina has sung Carmen on a number of major international stages: at the Bayerische Staatsoper in Munich at the start of the season, then at the Deutsche Oper in Berlin, as well as in Carrie Cracknell's new production at the Metropolitan Opera in New York at the end of last

year, and now once again at the Royal Opera House in London since 5 April 2024, in an original production by Damiano Michieletto. She will reprise the role again this summer at the Glyndebourne Festival, and then in Naples.

It's "50 shades of Carmen" according to Aigul Akhmetshina, who was a feminist Carmen in New York directed by Carrie Cracknell (the production transposed the libretto to a firearms factory in the United States) and has been a symbol of freedom in London since 5 April, opposite Piotr Beczala's Don José. With his production for Covent Garden, Damiano Michieletto believes that "Carmen is above all about freedom: on the one hand, the female protagonist embodies an idea of absolute freedom, which often implies a life on the margins, like a stray animal; on the other, Don José's mother tries to keep control over her son, forcing him to obey even if it means derailing his will". The director adds that Don José's mother "is not directly present in the libretto, but her strength is manifested through the character of Micaëla. The final tragedy, which leads to Carmen's feminicide, thus takes on the appearance of a metaphorical battle between two opposing existential models". Given her temperament, we can imagine that Aigul Akhmetshina will have no great difficulty in embodying this image of freedom.

In some respects, the young mezzo seems to recognise herself in Bizet's character: "she is very honest, every time she says 'I love you' to someone, she means it; every time, she is sincerely convinced that she loves; she is driven by this irrepressible need to live and feel something". While Aigul Akhmetshina says she is "more cautious" than Carmen, she also says she "can do anything on stage" and is "addicted to adrenalin, like all artists". At 27, the mezzosoprano is "in a hurry to live". Since childhood, she has claimed to have no time to lose. She's already done a lot and she's still very young. Does she have time? She thinks not, "life goes very fast".

The new production of Carmen at London's Royal Opera House ran from 5 April to 31 May 2024. The production was captured on video for worldwide cinema release in partner cinemas on 1 May. •

# Interview with conductor David Stern, before Opera Fuoco's 20th anniversary concert

Opera Fuoco, a period-instrument opera company, was co-founded in 2003 by conductor David Stern, violinist Katharina Wolff and gambist Jay Bernfeld. In 2008, it joined a workshop of young singers, some of whose alumni (Adèle Charvet, Vannina Santoni, Benoît Rameau, Lea Desandre, Clémentine Margaine) are now regulars on French and international stages. Although the repertoire initially covers the Baroque period, Cherubini's Médée takes the independent variable-geometry orchestra into another dimension, opening the door to Mozart, then to later eras up to Porter, Korngold and Bernstein. In addition to concert and stage performances, there is no shortage of projects, including recordings of rare works, web series, chamber music and masterclasses. The Théâtre des Champs-Élysées hosted a concert celebrating Opera Fuoco's 20th anniversary. An opportunity to look back with David Stern, also Principal Conductor of Palm Beach Opera (Florida), on two decades of music, young hopefuls and a changing operatic world.

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company conceived by a conductor, a violinist and a gambist is already proof of an ensemble unlike any other?

David Stern (DS): Indeed. What really interested me was sharing experience, finding the flame of the text in the song, using period instruments that could translate the rhetorical side of a phrase in Italian, French or English in a different way to modern instruments. When I launched Fuoco, I immediately wanted to work with young singers. I hadn't necessarily thought of an opera workshop, but that has since become the basis of our approach, through 'generations' over three years. I'm not doing this work for myself, I'm doing it to serve young people!

## TV: When you audition future singers for the Atelier Lyrique, do you already have a repertoire in mind for them?

DS: I already have some ideas beforehand, because you still have to programme in advance, but with each generation, I choose repertoire according to the sensitivity and abilities I identify in the singers. When Vannina Santoni finished her three years with us, her voice was developing, and I wanted to offer her her first major role. I created an entire production of Donizetti's L'Élixir d'amour around her. She sang Norina magnificently, even though she was still young. Opera houses that often want well-known names plan five years in advance With Opera Fuoco, we mainly do productions with singers from the troupe, sometimes with former members of the Atelier, who have become more experienced and are ready to tackle broader repertoires. In the projects we have with big names - Raffaella Milanesi, Vivica Genaux, Danielle de Niese... - we also notice that the singers are even better. Everyone is caught up in this talent and momentum.

## TV: Does the relationship between experienced instrumentalists and singers emerging from their studies help these young people make the transition from theory to practice?

**DS**: Absolutely, because they have little professional experience and need to be exposed to the reality of the profession. A youth orchestra would certainly give them a lot, but our experienced musicians get them into the swing of things straight away. I'm touched that a number of our singers have found a safe space with us, which I hadn't consciously conceived. The challenges of becoming a professional singer today are immense. You can be covered in glory one day, fail on stage the next and jeopardise your career. We want to give them time to develop, to ask themselves questions, while avoiding the pressure of systematic perfection. If you don't mess up, you can't learn. In the French music curriculum, the

Thibault Vicq (OperaOnline - TV): A lyric term "cycle de perfectionnement" is used - it's so pretentious! It's an irrational term - seeking the unattainable - and even contemptuous, implying that you can never be perfect. Nobody is perfect, we simply have to aspire to ever greater modesty and sincerity.

## TV: The current opera scene is such that young singers are leaving their mark?

DS: Young people who need to perform are sometimes unfairly given roles that are unsuited to their voices. This can make them vulnerable, with disastrous consequences. My door is always open to members of the current generation and former members. They can come and work, ask me for advice on a role they've been offered, prepare projects... Fuoco is interested in each individual, to give young singers the confidence to continue in this profession. And that's no mean feat! You can be unfairly crushed by subjective judgements at a key moment in your career. And that's not counting the other soft skills you need to acquire: looking for an agent, talking to one, preparing for an audition, choosing the works and the order in which you're going to perform them. All too often, singers plan to audition pieces that a director likes, but that they themselves don't like to sing, and so unconsciously don't invest as much as they could. So sometimes you have to make difficult choices and turn down a project when you know it's not for you.

## TV: How do you work on the "sound of the text" that you mentioned earlier?

**DS:** The orchestra very often tries to find out the meaning of the arias. They want to know if it's 'heroic' or 'tragic', what the key words are and where they are in the score. I appreciate that this search comes from the instrumentalists themselves, in the nuance of the text rather than simply on the basis of tempo, measure and the period of composition. It's very important to me that they feel involved, and that the singers understand that diction is also part of musical expression. So the singers and instrumentalists work together. Sometimes some of the woodwind soloists have individual discussions with a singer to find common ground on the character of an interpretation. But there's a balance to be struck: the text may be essential, but sometimes you have to be careful not to get too lost in the diction, so that you can still sing it.

## TV : Stéphane Lissner has asked you to conduct the first Académie of the Festival d'Aix-en-Provence. What is the difference between an institutional academy, as in Aix, and a programme for young singers with an ensemble like Opera Fuoco?

DS: Our workshop gives them time to get to know themselves and to make themselves

known. Before starting the variations, they have to learn the theme. That's what they do with us. Once you've mastered the basics of Händel, Mozart and Donizetti, you can sing anything. The Festival d'Aix-en-Provence offers a lot of new works and improvisation, which push the singer further and further. I admire this constant curiosity and research. Even if the approach was very different from ours at the time, singers already had to be 'ready' for the media. They always had to be presented as the stars of the future. But you never know how a career is going to develop. The singers at Fuoco have generally just obtained their Bachelor's degree, or sometimes they're still at Master's level. At that age, they need to be protected as much as they need to be pushed.

## TV: For your programming at Opera Fuoco. are you also influenced by what you conduct at the Palm Beach Opera?

DS: Completely! At the Palm Beach Opera, I only work on the great repertoire with a modern orchestra and great voices at an insane speed. Working with musicians, you have to know how to work in a hurry as well as how to sustain the imagination of the discourse over a long period of time. The contrast and complementarity between these two situations, from the knowledge of the repertoire to the flexibility of the singers, is enormously nourishing for me.

## TV: Through its cross-disciplinary projects, Opera Fuoco has succeeded in placing itself 'between the lines' of the opera world. How have you seen this environment evolve over the last twenty years?

DS: Twenty years ago, stage directors reigned supreme, choosing the singers and the works. Most of the time, when the staging concept is more important than the work, it doesn't work, because it doesn't convey the 'truth' of the music. It's such a waste of time and money! For my part, I look for directors who understand, appreciate and respect the 'heart' of the work. Singing is difficult, and you have to be able to do it in the right conditions. And if there's one thing I try to pass on to the singers of Fuoco, it's an awareness of their presence on stage, so that the day they're asked to do something absurd, they can say no, to protect themselves. And now is more the time to do that. So that's what I've seen change in twenty years. I don't think there's any point in having tribunes against directors. We're all here to work together. Opera must remain a dialogue between artists to tell a story. As soon as it works, it's the most beautiful art form there is. We have to fight to keep it that way! •

# Tézier's infernal dance and Netrebko in *La Gioconda* in Naples

Anna Netrebko and Jonas Kaufmann recently performed their first roles under Antonio Pappano at the Salzburg Easter Festival. They are back at the Teatro di San Carlo in Naples alongside Ludovic Tézier's extraordinary Barnaba. Eve-Maud Hubeaux replaced Anita Rachvelishvili, who was still unable to perform. The baritone and soprano, admirably accompanied by the orchestra conducted by Pinchas Steinberg, took the evening to new heights.



The performance of La Gioconda transcended the boundaries of a simple show to become a theatrical experience on an unprecedented scale. This exceptional event was the fruit of the union of exceptional talents on stage.

From start to finish, Ludovic Tezier provided the spy Barnaba - one of the most cruelly unhinged characters in the history of opera - with all the vocal and dramatic nuances possible in such a

Opposite him, Anna Netrebko shone in the role of Gioconda. Although she has had a tendency in recent years to overload the role with chesty low notes, she knew how to use them to good effect (particularly at the breathtaking start of where she weeps for her betrayed love), then free herself from them to emit magnificent high notes, as at the end of this aria where the voice during part of Act II and Act III, the big scene at

miraculously rises, little by little, to end up with an astonishing lightness. She had already graced us with an ethereal, pianistic high, held for a long time, literally sublime in the phrase "Madre! Enzo adorato! Ah Come t'amo!"

Alongside these two imposing figures, Eve-Maud Hubeaux and Jonas Kaufmann also shone in their respective roles, adding an extra dimension to the opera's dramatic richness.

Kaufmann, not yet fully warmed up, leads the way in his first confrontation ("Enzo Grimaldo. Principe di Santafior, che pensi?") with Netrebko. The great aria that follows is fabulous in its arrogance; it allows him to use all the facets of his sovereign voice. In "Pescator", he also the "Tradita!... Ahimé! Ahimé!" in the first act, demonstrates a lightness that does not hide Barnaba's devious and cunning character. Finally, although the character becomes more discreet

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the end with Anna Netrebko is a moment of rare

Under the masterful direction of Pinchas created a spellbinding canvas of sound, highlighting every moment of the work with remarkable precision and sensitivity. Every note was executed with impressive virtuosity, creating an immersive atmosphere that captivated the audience from start to finish. In short, this performance of La Gioconda transcended expectations to become an unforgettable theatrical experience.
